We are committed to reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions both within our operations and across Jefferson County, adapting our operations to climate impacts, and strengthening regional resilience.

Goals 2-4 support our overall GHG target. JTA aims to achieve a **75% reduction** in our overall operational GHG emissions by 2035, compared to 2022 levels, and a **95% reduction** by 2050.
