



Visibility Matters: Stay Safe While Waiting for Your Bus

Tips for Being Seen at the Bus Stop After Dark

Bright color clothing is easier for Operators (and other drivers on the road) to see you in the dark. Wearing light or bright clothes or jackets will help keep you safe as well as make sure you catch your bus.

Reflective gear will be lit up with approaching headlights increasing your visibility to all drivers on the road.

To signal an approaching bus, it is helpful to move a light such as your cell phone around; stationary and red lights are not easily identifiable to Operators as a bus rider.

Never shine a flashlight or other bright light in an Operator's eyes.

As soon as the bus door opens several lights on the inside and outside of the bus are activated, waiting for the bus to come to a complete stop and the door to open will help light the way to the bus and help the Operator see you.
